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## Client Rights

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As a client of The George Hull Centre, you have a right:

- ❖ To be treated with dignity, respect and without discrimination on the basis of race, religion, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation or socio-economic status.
- ❖ To privacy and confidentiality, except when we are required to disclose or share information because of legal or professional obligations.
- ❖ To receive service in program spaces that are safe, clean and accessible.
- ❖ To make a complaint if you are dissatisfied with the service you are receiving.

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## Confidentiality

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Our policy is to keep information about your child and family confidential. Confidentiality means that information about your child and family that you share with staff may be shared with supervisors or other staff on the team for the purposes of case consultation, clinical supervision or quality assurance but will not be shared with anyone else outside the Centre without your informed consent.

However, you should know that there are some circumstances in which we are required to disclose or share information because of legal or professional obligations. These are the circumstances:

- ❖ The George Hull Centre must obey subpoenas, court orders, and search warrants.
- ❖ The George Hull Centre has the legal duty to report suspected child abuse and neglect to a children's aid society.
- ❖ The George Hull Centre may at times share information with others in extreme situations such as threats of suicide or homicide or serious risk of harm to self or others.

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## Complaints or Concerns

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The Centre provides clients with the best service possible. If you are ever dissatisfied with the service you are receiving or think something needs to change, we encourage you to speak to staff or the Program Manager as a first step. If you are still dissatisfied, you are welcome to contact Kim Curran, Director of Prevention and Early Intervention and/or Susan Chamberlain, the Centre's Executive Director.



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## Right Help Right Now Consultation Service

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The George Hull Centre Right Help Right Now Consultation Service is available to families with children aged six and under who are currently clients of the centre. Social workers from the George Hull Centre Community Clinic provide single session consultation appointments with very limited wait times to families with concerns regarding their children's social and emotional development, behaviour, learning, communication or relationship difficulties. Often, these challenges are getting in the way of children experiencing success in their daily lives. Consultation appointments can be arranged by asking a staff member in the program you are currently attending to make a referral. If you and/or your child need more service than the consultation offers, then the counselor will help to make a referral for ongoing service at either The George Hull Centre or at another organization which will meet you or your child's needs.

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## Family Group Conferencing

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Family Group Conferencing (FGC) is an alternative culturally sensitive approach to child protection and working with families where the child is in need of protection. The FGC process brings together family members to construct a plan of care for their children that addresses concerns identified by child welfare/children's mental health professionals. The main objective of FGC is to empower marginalized families and give the extended family group a voice in the decision-making process to ensure the safety and well-being of children who are at significant risk of or in need of protection from abuse and neglect.

The FGC Ontario Provincial Resource is a provincial locus of expertise and best practice. We provide training and consultation to service providers and organizations across Ontario and maintain a provincial roster of FGC coordinators, trainers and mentors.

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## The George Hull EarlyON Child and Family Centres

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The George Hull EarlyON Child and Family Centres offer programs to children (aged birth to six years) and their parents/caregivers at five different locations in Central and North Etobicoke. Regular drop-in and registered programs encourage positive adult-child interaction, provide exposure to toys, activities and materials and facilitate early learning. School readiness programs and kindergarten enrichment programs support children in their transitions to school. Our Early Childhood Educators and other staff provide information on child development to parents/caregivers through workshops and one on one discussions. They also support parents in identifying special or additional needs of their children and accessing referrals to specialized services as needed.

The Community Engagement Program provides rich volunteer opportunities for community members to gain experience and build their skills and it supports various community and centre activities that enhance life for children and families. Numerous events, such as the Community Breakfast and Spring Community Fair bring community members together.

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## Every Child Belongs Special Needs Resourcing

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The Every Child Belongs service provides extra support for children in licensed child care settings. Special Needs Resource Consultants assist childcare providers to effectively meet the needs of children with special needs up to the age of 12 years old. Consultants offer early identification, advice on programming for children with special needs, and problem solving. Consultants use a variety of strategies including observation, role modeling, and hands on training. Screening tools are used to identify specific developmental needs and guide recommendations to promote inclusion.
